The more easily aroused women were, the lower their sexual satisfaction tended to be. "Men assume that women who are always ready to go get more out of sex," says study author Amy Lykins, Ph.D. "That's not always the case." For these women, sex may be only a momentary high, so they're left always wanting more.

Starbucks may be the ultimate pickup spot. Pleasant smells could help you score her number, according to new research from France. Women were more likely to give men their phone numbers when approached at delicious-smelling places-bakeries, coffee shops, pastry shops-than when they were chatted up in clothing stores or banks. Enticing scents may lift her mood, making her more receptive to your advances.

LIGHT A FIRST-DATE FIRE

There's a scientific reason why sweating together is sexy. A new study in the Journal of Experimental Social Psychology suggests that moving in sync with her could enhance your connection. When people's body movements were similar in style and flow, they rated their interactions as more positive. Matching your movements-by, say, exercising togethercan create closeness, helping you bond. Plan active dates, such as hiking or rock climbing, that have you moving in sync, says study author Tanya Vacharkulksemsuk, Ph.D.(c).
